Introduction:



Scholars' School was established in 2001 and is primarily a boarding/residential school. It is a unique upcoming school with a vision and mission of producing balanced, civilized and practically perfect citizens. The curriculum is framed in such a manner that there is an equal emphasis on *English language*, *the Sciences and Islamiyat*.

Our school has highly motivated and dedicated staff members. We have created such an environment in the institute where our students feel free to converse in English and at the same time are good Qaris' of Quran and study Tafseer and Hadith continuously. We allow them to play for limited hours but pray regularly five times a day. We inculcate habits of truthfulness, straight forwardness, simplicity, helpfulness and hardwork which are the qualities of success for any nation.

English is the nearest thing there has ever been to a global language. Its worldwide reach is much greater than anything achieved historically by Arabic, Latin or French, and there has never been a language as widely spoken as English. Be it business, academics, science, computing, education, transportation, politics and entertainment, English has already established itself as the de facto lingua franca (common language).

English is thus the medium of communication in our school. Science is taught through practicals and our aim is to develop scientific temper in our scholars.

Likewise, religion is not only taught but practiced by conducting regular five time prayers, Fasting, recitation of Qur'aan and the study of Sunnah and Tafseer as compulsory subjects free of any sectarianism. *Al-Hamdulillah*, Scholars' School has set a trend in the field of education in the valley.

We hope that the candle we have enlightened will keep glowing and a day will come when its light shall illuminate all the shadows and darkness of these times.

More about Scholars' School

The school was established exclusively as a boarding school, where students from far-flung areas could reside and study with all the amenities of a city available to them.

Thus, with a humble beginning in 2001, the school started functioning at Natipora, Srinagar as a boarding-cum-day school. Over the course of time, the management realized the need for relocating to a quiet, natural & clean environment and thus the boarding school (boys) was established at Dara, Harwan among the picturesque hills of the Zabarwan/Harmukh mountain ranges.

The boarding classes for Primary (both boys & girls) and middle and higher classes (for girls) continues to operate at our campus at Natipora, Srinagar.

Scholars' School with its two separate wings caters to both the rural and urban areas. The special moral approach adopted here helps students to adjust with each other as well as to the surrounding environment comfortably. It is firmly embedded in the minds of the scholars as-well-as the teachers/wardens that only finely made building material does not make beautiful buildings, it is the expertise of the builders to make homes out of materials which others consider less refined.

At Scholars' School, special emphasis is laid on communication in English language. Fortunately or un-fortunately, the society has made it mandatory for students to start life on a diet of English language and anyone not adhering to this dictum is looked down upon. Apart from English, we also lay emphasis on Urdu and Kashmiri. The respective subject teachers take care of the language to the best of their knowledge and limitations of time.

A school is not a jail; in fact it is more than a home. Whatever a scholar cannot think of doing at home is possible here, depending on how soon we can make the scholar feel at home and we do. After the school hours, school work, prayers and recreation are part of their growing up. At the end of a session, it is not surprising if a particular scholar is not enthusiastic about going home. After all *Home is where the heart is.*

Location | Campus:



With a humble beginning in the year 2001, the school started functioning at Budshah Nagar, Natipora, Srinagar as a boarding-cum-day school. Over the last twenty years, the school has flourished over two separate campuses within the municipal limits of the Srinagar city.

The main campus is located at a Twenty minute drive from the Srinagar International Airport and at a Ten minute drive from the Srinagar Railway Station.

a. Natipora Campus:

The head office and the main campus are located at Stadium Colony, Budshah Nagar, Natipora, Srinagar and comprises of School Block for Boys and Girls (Boarding and Day Scholars) and Primary Boys and Girls Hostel Block

• School Block for Boys and Girls (Boarding and Day Scholars):

Scholars' School, Natipora is housed in a three storied building with separate sections for boy and girl scholars from class 5th and above. The school has day as well as boarding scholars and caters to the whole of Jammu and Kashmir from Jammu, Doda, Kishtwar all the way upto Zanskar, Leh apart from the students in the immediate vicinity of the school.

The school provides boarding facilities to students from far flung and remote areas of the union territory, where they are taught the highest values of simplicity, piousness, straight forwardness, hard work and struggle for success in this world and the in the hereafter.

The school curriculum is set in such a manner that there is equal emphasis on modern scientific, moral and religious education. We believe that our daughters are the nation builders as they are responsible for the education of our coming generations.



Primary Boys and Girls Hostel Block:

The hostel block for primary boys and girl scholars at Stadium Colony, Budshah Nagar, Natipora is situated at a five minutes' walk from the school campus. The boarding scholars walk to and fro to their school every day along with their wardens.

The students reside in well-lit and well-ventilated dormitories with attached change rooms and wash rooms. The campus has a separate reception, a guest room for parents and a canteen for refreshments and toiletries. It also comprises of a Mess block and Dining Hall.

Parent meetings are restricted strictly to Sundays only and Phone calls are allowed once a week on a predetermined day. Students are allowed a twenty four hour leave once a month preferably towards a weekend. Special leaves are also granted in case of family engagements or emergencies.













b. Scholars' School-Boys Wing at Dara, Harwan:



The second campus situated at Padshah Pal, Dara, Harwan, Srinagar among Harmukh Hills atop the Dachigam Wildlife Sanctuary is exclusively a boarding school for boys from Classes 6th to 10th. The Scholars' School started with a humble beginning in 2001 at Natipora, Srinagar as a boarding-cum-day school. During the course of the next 15 years, the management realized the need for relocating to a quiet, natural & clean environment and thus the boarding school (for boys only) was established at Dara, Harwan among the picturesque hills of the Zabarwan/Harmukh ranges.

The small valley that we call 'scholars'

valley' is surrounded by hills on three sides and on the fourth side overlooks the Dachigam Wildlife Sanctuary, the Dal Lake and most of the Shehr-e-Khas. A stream of fresh glacial water flows through the campus. A swimming pool located by this stream is used by the scholars in the summer months to cool off the summer heat.


It is an environment rarely offered by schools in large and small cities in India. All the boys are able to seek advice from the teaching staff, the Wellness Centre and the school counselor living on the school campus throughout the seven day week. Boys discover that they have much more time to study and pursue their wider interests.

At Scholars' School, leadership is taught within the schools' curriculum as well as through a whole range of opportunities such as leading clubs and societies and sports teams. House life through the perfect system also provides leadership and collaborative experience. Leadership is also developed through innovative and creative projects linked to the schools social service program to leading and participating in numerous academic and other committees that exist to discuss topics that range from food to the library and games to technology.

The School is also most fortunate to be able to offer clean air and a wonderful space for the boys to grow up and learn in.

There is a strict 24-hour time table that includes the five time prayers, morning exercise, breakfast, schooling, lunch, games, recreation and extra-curricular activities. The students go on outings, trekking, picnics and educational tours on a regular basis.

Parent meetings are restricted strictly to Sundays only and Phone calls are allowed once a week on a predetermined day. Students are allowed a twenty four hour leave once a month preferably towards a weekend. Special leaves are also granted in case of family engagements or emergencies.



Facilities:

I. Residential Facilities:



Boarding students reside in dormitories amidst scenic surroundings. The dormitories are spacious and well ventilated. Each dormitory is under the supervision of a warden. It is noteworthy to mention that the wardens are the teachers who teach the students in the school, thereby providing every boarding student emotional security and guidance.

A boarding student at scholars' school is taught the foundations of attitude and skill, preparing every student for life 'beyond the school'. A boarding student is taught the art of dressing to perfection, presenting a neat and orderly appearance with lessons in tidiness and importance of a disciplined and a healthy life.

The sermons that are delivered by guests in the Friday prayers in the mosque all focus on the moral education of the scholars in particular and the scholars' family in general.







ii. Science Laboratory:

The school has purpose-built, fully equipped science laboratories that are modern and safe. The higher classes (8th, 9th& 10th) regularly perform different activities in the laboratory which bridges the gap between theoretical lessons and the practical world.





















iii. Information and Communication Technology Laboratories:

The fully networked ICT laboratories are equipped with the latest hardware, state of the art IT applications including interactive learning tools and internet connectivity.

The school is one of the first schools in the valley to be labeled as a 'Smartclass Enabled' school. Adopting technology to enhance information and knowhow of the students is the need of the hour. Having interactive boards in a classroom will surely wean away the students from televisions and video games and glue them to their classrooms.







iv. Library:

A well-resourced library enables the students to enrich and expand their horizons. The Scholars' School library known as the **Knowledge / Resource Center** provides academic resources for all constituents of the school-the scholars, faculty and administrative staff. Our school library has a vast and diverse collection of books for children at all levels. The library strives to make resources readily accessible when and wherever they are needed to enhance and promote the total growth and development of the students. The library collections stand out around documents consisting of books and multimedia on variety of subjects. Library provides reprographic services along with scanning and color printouts to its patrons.







The School Library aims to do the following:

- Support the educational aims of the school by making the library central and integral to the independent learning processes within the school.
- Provide services which will enable the scholars to become more responsible for their own learning and prepare for university by helping them develop their research and study skills.
- Enrich the scholars' curricular experiences by providing appropriate resources. Knowledge of the curriculum enables staff to purchase relevant resources and provide an environment that is conducive and will encourage divergent and reflective study.
- Provide an environment which encourages relaxation and private reading.
- Give the scholars a sense of 'ownership' of their Library. Suggestions by boys for resources are always welcomed. The Library Council meets regularly, with representation from the scholars and the staff.
- Arrange workshops and talks by writers and illustrators which will inspire, enthuse and entertain the scholars'.

v. Smart Classes:



Now, imagine a science teacher explaining how a DNA replicates, a history teacher teaching a class about the Harappan Civilization or a Geography teacher teaching how Block Mountains are formed. The best of teachers take pains to explain the concepts largely depending on their own abilities. The students listen to the teachers, try to decipher the figures drawn on the whiteboard and read from their text books, take notes and try hard to visualize how it happens and remember.

A Smart class brings about a complete transformation in classrooms. The Science teacher while explaining how a DNA replicates is able to show the class a 3D animation of the DNA replication process on a large screen. He/She can explain the fine points of the process, zoom in to show the relevant visuals; freeze and annotate when and where they needs to emphasize. Similarly, the History teacher shows the class a virtual walk through of the Harappan Civilization. Uncovering the relevant parts step by step as a part of the lesson plan, while the Geography teacher shows a virtual Block mountain being formed...all with engaging animations, colors, music, sounds and voice.

The teachers gain complete attention and interest of every child in the class. Every child gets a visual input on how it happens and the concepts are well understood and internalized.

The result: faster and accurate understanding of the concepts in class and consequently improvement in the overall academic performance of students.

vi. Secure Campus:

The school is safe and secure with strong perimeter fencing. A constant vigil is maintained with state of the art Closed-Circuit Television Cameras and a Public Address System installed throughout the campus for round the clock surveillance.

Trained security staff is placed at all points of entry and exit to regulate the movement of students, staff and visitors on a round the clock basis.

vii. Health Care:

The campus has a first aid dispensary and a trained nurse for administering first aid. Periodic Eye, Dental and general health checkups are conducted in association with the local health department and a complete medical record of the students is maintained.

An ambulance vehicle is available 24-hours for instant transport to the nearest health centre or hospital in case any emergency arises.



viii. Hostel Mess:

A nutritious diet is essential to healthy brain development in children, which is critical to good learning. Our hostel mess team prepares fresh meals every day.

There is a heavy morning breakfast, lunch, afternoon tea and a dinner. Non-vegetarian food is prepared twice a week and Eggs/Cheese is prepared once a week. Lentils (Dal) and vegetables are prepared alternately for lunch and dinner for the remaining days of a week.

Having good eating habits and a balanced diet supports children's health and well-being and minimises the risk of illness.

Eating habits developed in the early years are likely to have a life-long influence. Hence, the presence of a teacher/warden at every table ensures that every meal is a lesson in proper eating etiquette. This also ensures that every student has enough to eat and that no food is wasted.

ix. Canteen:



The school canteen Dara, Harwan is spread over an area of around 1000 square feet and overlooks the Swimming Pool. The canteen provides Snacks such as Sandwiches, Samosas, Burgers, Noodles and Patties; Milk, Yogurt, Juices and hot beverages like Tea and Coffee.

The food items are prepared by an experienced Chef and are stored in neat and tidy, temperature controlled display shelves. The students are allowed to purchase a limited amount of snacks from the canteen in order to take care of their health and prevent wasteful expense of pocket money.







x. Swimming Pool:

The Swimming Pool at Dara, Harwan is located over an area of more than 2100 square feet. It is located by the stream that flows along the length of the campus and is fed by the clean and cold glacial waters of the Thajiwas Glacier.

Students and staff make good use of the Swimming Pool by cooling off in the cold glacial water during the scorching summer months.

Besides this, regular swimming competitions are held as a sport in order to break the monotonous nature of hostel life and make the student life at Scholars' School a joyous experience.











Academics:

Academic excellence is the central aspect of any educational institute. The teaching staff at Scholars' School, working as teachers and wardens are either trained graduates or post-graduates in their subjects.

The Supervisors and the Principal evaluate the performance of the teachers on a daily basis through KURPC (know concept, understand concept, read and visualize it, plan for one week, check you plan) interaction and fortnightly Classroom Observation.

The students are motivated to focus on the curriculum and extra-curricular activities are actively promoted so that the young minds are trained and molded into active members of the society. The teaching-learning process is student centric

• Affiliation:

The school is affiliated to the Jammu and Kashmir Board of School Education. The school follows the Syllabi and Courses of Study prescribed for Classes 8th, 9th and 10th.


• Academic Session:

The scholastic or academic session after the implementation of the National Education Policy-2020 begins in the month of April and ends in the last week of March. The academic session is divided into two terms. The first term extends from April to September and the second term from October to March.

• Examination/Evaluation:

To assess the progress of each student, regular class or unit based formative assessments are given to the students. Besides these formative assessments, summative assessments at the end of each term are given to the students in order to identify the potential learners. The first term examination is to be held in the month of August/September. The second term examination is to be held in the months of March/April.

No special arrangements for examination are made for the students who willfully remain absent from the term examinations. Potential learners are identified after the formative and summative



The results of the examinations are communicated to the parents by way of progress reports.



Promotions are decided in consultation with the subject teachers at the end of the academic year. Promotion is granted on the basis of marks obtained in all the formative (Unit) and summative (Term) assessments.

The result declared at the end of the academic session is final and cannot be reconsidered under any circumstances as it gets countersigned by the concerned Zonal Education Officer and Chief Education Officer.

The minimum pass marks in each subject is 40%. Annual awards and prizes are distributed on the basis of the overall performance of the students. Absence in any examination is considered as having obtained NO MARKS in it.

A student who resorts to malpractice in any examination is awarded zero marks in that particular subject. Repeated incidents of malpractice may lead to discharge of the student from the school record.

The answer sheets are available to the parents for rechecking /reevaluation for a period of one week from the declaration of final result against a pre-determined fee.





Extra-curricular Activities:

The curricular activities form the main stay of the academic calendar. However, extra-curricular activities are also encouraged on regular basis in order to break the monotony of the curriculum. Activities such as debates, seminars, discussions, Na'at competitions, quiz competitions, painting competitions and sports festivals are organized on different levels.

All these activities have been suitably adjusted into the Activity Calendar of the school. The excitement and enthusiasm generated by these events is enormous and enables all the students to take part in a wide range of activities designed to embolden them and widen their horizons. All the students are encouraged to take part in such activities including sports, trekking and educational tours and camps.

Admissions:

Admissions from Class Nursery to Class 9th are granted from the month of April till June every year as per the availability of seats on a first come first serve basis.

Assessment/Interview:

- a. Students who are registered for admission are required to go through a basic assessment/evaluation test to assess the clarity of basic concepts in the core subjects of Mathematics, English and Urdu
- b. The admission shall be solely granted on the basis of assessment/interview only.
- c. On admission of a student, the course of study shall be decided on the basis of the students' performance and in consultation with the parent/guardian. It shall be binding on all.

• Admission Process:

- a. The Admission Form and the School Prospectus can be obtained from our head office Budshah Nagar, Natipora, Srinagar or the branch office Dara, Harwan, Srinagar against a nominal payment.
- b. The admission form dully filled (as per school records) along with Discharge Certificate (duly countersigned by the ZEO/CEO), six recent colored passport size photographs and a photo copy of the students Aadhaar card is to be submitted at the time of admission.
- c. In case the Discharge Certificate is not available at the time of admission, a Date of Birth Certificate issued by the previous school containing the **Students Name**, **Fathers Name**, **Mothers Name**, **D.O.B** may be submitted along with the Admission Form and the student shall be granted provisional admission till the submission of the Discharge Certificate (duly countersigned by the ZEO/CEO) within fifteen working days failing which the admission of the student may be cancelled.
- d. In case a student is seeking admission in Pre-Primary or Class 1st, the Date of Birth Certificate issued by the concerned Municipal Committee/Corporation (in case of Urban areas) or the concerned Police Station (in case of Rural Areas) shall be submitted along with the admission form.



Fee Structure:

- 1. The parent/guardian is required to pay the annual fee on a yearly basis.
- 2. The monthly fee is to be paid on a semester basis as per the following schedule:

- 3. The parent/guardian is required to pay the fee within the 15th of the first month of the respective semester.
- 4. In case the fee is not deposited within the time line, a late fee of Rs. 100 per week shall be levied. If the fee is not deposited within 60 days of the semester, the name of the student shall be struck off from the school records.
- 5. The fee may be deposited in cash in the office against a receipt or may be deposited into the school bank account no.: 0524 0201 0000 0009. Cheques shall not be accepted.

Withdrawal:

Any parent desirous of withdrawing his/her wards name from the rolls of the school should convey the same in writing on the prescribed format. The parent/guardian will have to clear his outstanding dues (if any). The Discharge Certificate shall be issued within 15 working days from the date of application.

The bedding and belongings should be collected within one week. Any claim arising thereafter shall not be entertained.

Rules and Regulations:

- 1. All rooms are equipped with individual (double-storey) beds. Students sharing a dormitory have to be friendly, helping and co-operative.
- 2. The students have to follow the school/hostel time table strictly.
- 3. The parents/guardians are allowed to meet their wards only on Sundays and any such requests shall not be entertained on any other day, unless there are compelling reasons.
- 4. The students are allowed to speak to their parents/guardians only on Sundays and no calls shall be entertained except Sundays.
- 5. Any student found guilty of indulging in unlawful activities in the school/hostelshall be expelled from the school or fined as decided by the Disciplinary Committee.
- 6. Students are not allowed to keep any electronic item such as mobile phones, MP3 players, radio sets, video games etc., in their possession.
- 7. Students are not allowed to keep valuable items such as Jewellery or cash in their possession.
- 8. In case students are found to have been in possession of any valuable item or electronic item, the same will be seized immediately.

Disqualification (Hostel):

A boarding student is liable for disqualification from the hostel in case of gross misconduct, indecent manners, misbehavior, unlawful and illegal activities and shall include the following:

- Use of any gadget, electronic or electric appliance.
- Holding unauthorized meetings and demonstrations.
- Any form of gambling or bargaining in or outside the hostel premises.
- Consumption of intoxicants in or outside the hostel premises.
- Behaving in a pervasive manner so as to cause physical or mental torture to any fellow student or a member of the staff.
- Intentionally raising political, regional or religious issues to hurt the sentiments of fellow students.
- Unauthorized departure from the campus or by giving slip to the watch and ward of the school.
- Obscene or immoral discussions, cursing, instigating or provoking.

- 9. It is compulsory for the students to have all their meals in the dining hall. The students are not allowed to carry their meals into their rooms except in the case of illness, in which case prior permission from the warden is required.
- Food shall not be served beyond the time specified and students are not allowed to enter into the 10. mess unnecessarily.
- Hosteliers desirous of availing leave from classes or to go home whatever the reason, shall apply in 11. writing, giving reason for the same and must submit it to the Principal, through the Chief Warden/Public Relations Officer.
- A minimum of 90% attendance (term-wise) is required to retain the hostel accommodation for the 12. next session.
- Every boarding student is bound to offer the five time prayers in congregation. 13.
- 14. The students must be dressed in the prescribed school apparel (track suit).

Dress Code:

The dress code of the school consists of the school uniform and track suits after school hours. The school uniform is to be worn during the schooling hours and when the students retire to their dormitories they are required to wear track suits. This is done to ensure cleanliness, uniformity and to instill a sense of discipline in the students. The details of the uniform are given below:
